

COL David G. Richardson

COL Richardson started his military career as an enlisted soldier in the South Dakota Army National Guard. After graduating from the University of South Dakota with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Health Service Administration in 1988 he was commissioned a Second Lieutenant as a Medical Service Corps Officer. COL Richardson completed a comptroller internship in 1992 and also has a Master's in Business Administration (MBA) from Syracuse University. COL Richardson currently serves as the Health Services Comptroller consultant to the Surgeon General and has held numerous comptroller positions across the Army Medical Department culminating as the MEDCOM Assistant Deputy Chief of Staff for Resource Management (G8). His previous assignments include the Chief of Staff, Europe Regional Medical Command, the ERM C G8, the Southern RMC G8 and the MEDCOM Director for Programming and Budget.

COL Richardson's military awards and decorations include the Legion of Merit, Bronze Star Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, (6 oak leaf clusters), Army Achievement Medal, Army Commendation Medal, Expert Field Medical Badge and the Parachutist Badge. He is also a member of the Order of Military Medical Merit (O2M3), and was awarded the 9A proficiency designation.
